

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 5772**

**OFFERED BY MR. MURPHY OF CONNECTICUT**

Page 5, line 13, strike “, supportive services,”.

Page 5, lines 23 through 25, strike “and to the availability of amounts made available in appropriation Acts”.

Page 17, line 18, after the period insert the following: “The Secretary may not require any State housing finance agency or other entity applying for project rental assistance funds under the demonstration program to identify in such application the eligible projects for which such funds will be used, and shall allow such agencies and applicants to subsequently identify such eligible projects pursuant to the making of commitments described in paragraph (3)(B).”.

At the end of the bill, add the following new section:

**1 SEC. 8. GAO STUDY.**

2 The Comptroller General of the United States shall  
3 conduct a study of the supportive housing for persons with  
4 disabilities program under section 811 of the Cranston-  
5 Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (42 U.S.C.  
6 8013) to determine the adequacy and effectiveness of such

1 program in assisting households of persons with disabil-  
2 ities. Such study shall determine—

3 (1) the total number of households assisted  
4 under such program;

5 (2) the extent to which households assisted  
6 under other programs of the Department of Housing  
7 and Urban Development that provide rental assist-  
8 ance or rental housing would be eligible to receive  
9 assistance under such section 811 program; and

10 (3) the extent to which households described in  
11 paragraph (2) who are eligible for, but not receiving,  
12 assistance under such section 811 program are re-  
13 ceiving supportive services from, or assisted by, the  
14 Department of Housing and Urban Development  
15 other than through the section 811 program (includ-  
16 ing under the Resident Opportunity and Self-Suffi-  
17 ciency program) or from other sources.

18 Upon the completion of the study required under this sec-  
19 tion, the Comptroller General shall submit a report to the  
20 Congress setting forth the findings and conclusions of the  
21 study.
